Greetings from the Jal Shakti Mantralaya

As you are aware, the monsoon season is upon us and it is important for us to work together to conserve rainwater and replenish our water sources. The Hon'ble Prime Minister has also written to you in this regard, requesting you to lead the charge on water conservation in your State. Separately, he also wrote to all Sarpanchs in the country motivating them to take up water conservation measures in the run up to the upcoming monsoons.

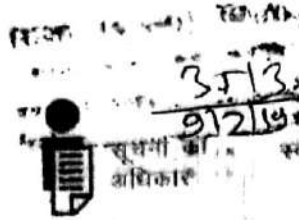

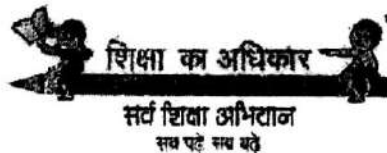
As you are aware, the Jal Shakti Abhiyan (JSA), focused on water conservation, commenced country wide with effect from 1st July, 2019 to 30th November, 2019 (in two phases) in order to address the water situation in the country. A concept note on the campaign is enclosed.

2. Senior officers from the Government from across the Ministries are being deputed as part of special teams to identified water stressed blocks and districts to work with local officials to redress the water scarcity situation in 5 specific intervention areas:

- Water conservation and rainwater harvesting
- Renovation of traditional and other water bodies / tanks.
- Reuse, borewell recharge structures
- Watershed development
- Intensive afforestation

3. The campaign also involves mobilizing the local people's participation to make the JSA a true Jan Andolan. Any Jan Andolan activity especially water conservation campaign can be enriched by the participation of school students who can act as awareness ambassadors.

4. In this regard, I will be grateful if you could kindly take comprehensive and necessary steps to involve all school students from class VI onwards in awareness creation and community education activities in water conservation on one identified date during the four months of JSA as a Jan Andolan activity in our endeavor of nation building. It is proposed that mass awareness creation activities & community education activities including rallies, nukkad nataks, plantation drives, workshops, seminars, etc. may be taken up on 15th July 2019, as part of Jan Andolan. Accordingly, you are requested to issue appropriate instructions to concerned authorities in your State / UT including all the District Collectors and District Education Officers.





Intervention Areas

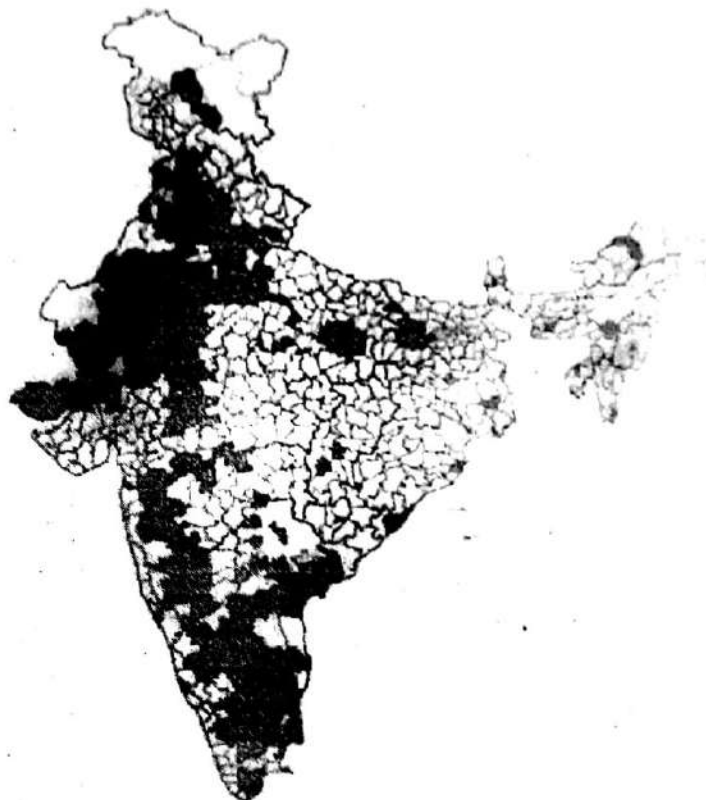

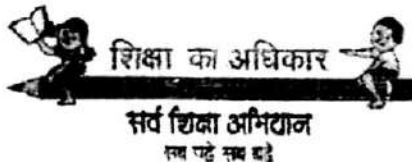
